

For "The Magic of Recycling" Show Coordinator:

Thank you for your interest in "Steffan Soule's The Magic of Recycling".
What follows is an outline of the show specifics:

TOPIC: Recycling and many aspects of Waste Reduction.

SCRIPT: Can be specific to your local recycling programs!

FOR SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES: Grades K through 6 OR 7 through 12.

AUDIENCE SIZE: 50 to 600 although 100 to 300 is the best.

SHOW LENGTH: 37 to 40 minutes.

SOUND SYSTEM: Provided by each school. Performer plugs in his own wireless lapel mic, unless the school has one to offer. Performer will require access to the mixer in order to plug in and adjust the sound level.

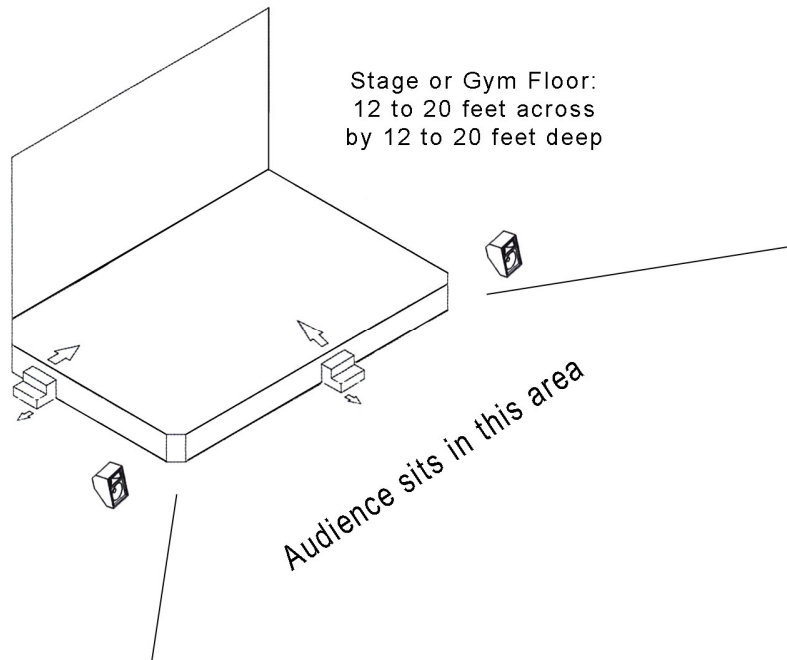
LIGHTING: Performer will make use of any existing lighting at each location. Please have access to your lighting available at the set up time.

INTRODUCTION: The Principal or the Recycling Coordinator reads Performer's printed introduction of the show to the audience.

STAGING, SET UP and TAKE DOWN:

- 1) The show is performed on a stage OR the floor of a gym, auditorium or assembly room. A stage is preferred.
- 2) The stage or performance area must be 12 feet across by 12 feet deep. A bigger stage or performance area is always preferred. An area of 20 feet across by 20 feet deep is preferred when the show is on the gym floor.
- 3) The audience must be seated IN FRONT of the stage or performance area and not on the direct sides. A center aisle is preferred but not mandatory.
- 4) The stage or performance area must be ready for Set Up ONE HOUR PRIOR to show time. (Classes may be held in the same room during set up and take down as long as the performance area is free.)
- 5) The show requires a 45 to 60 minute Take Down period.
- 6) Performer must load & unload the equipment for the show as close to the stage area as possible.
- 7) Unusual load in/out conditions may require assistance from people at each school in order for the Performer to stay on schedule.
